The following privacy policy applies to the use of our online offer www.Plast-MC.org (hereinafter "website").

We attach great importance to data protection. The collection and processing of your personal data takes place in compliance with the applicable data protection regulations, in particular the basic Data Protection Regulation (DSGVO).

1 Responsible Person

Responsible Person for the collection, processing and use of your personal data as defined in article 4 No. 7 DSGVO is:

2 General purposes of processing

We use No personally identifiable information for the purpose of operating the website.

3 What data we use and why

3.1 Hosting

The hosting services used by us serve to provide the following services: infrastructure and Platform services, computing capacity, storage space and database services, security services and technical maintenance for the purpose of the operation of the website.

Our hosting provider process stock data, contact data, content data, contract data, usage data, meta- and communication data of customers, interested parties and visitors of this site on the basis of our legitimate interests in an efficient and secure provision of our website according to Art. 6 Para 1 P. 1 f) DSGVO In Connection with 28 DSGVO.

3.2 Access data

We collect NO Information about you when you use this Website Use.

3.3 Cookies

We use NO so-called session cookies.

We use NO Persistent Cookies.

3.4 Data for the performance of our contractual obligations

We process NO personally identifiable information.

3.5 E-mail contact

If you contact us (e.g. By e-mail), we process your details for processing the request and in the event that in this connection issues arise.

If the data processing is carried out to carry out pre-contractual measures which are carried out at your request or, if you are already our customer, for the implementation of the contract, the legal basis for this data processing is Art. 6 Para. 1 P. 1 b) DSGVO.

We process further personal data only if you agree (Art. 6 Para. 1 P. 1 a) DSGVO) or we have a legitimate interest in the processing of your data (Art. 6 Para. 1 P. 1 f) DSGVO). A legitimate interest, for example, is to reply to your e-mail.

4 Storage time

If Unless specifically stated, we only store personal data for as long as this is necessary to comply with the purposes.

5 Your rights as being affected by data processing

According to the applicable laws, you have different rights regarding your personal data. If you would like to assert these rights, please send your request by e-mail or by mail with a clear identification of your person to the address mentioned in paragraph 1.

Below you will find an overview of your rights.

5.1 Right to confirmation and information

You have the right to a clear information about the processing of your personal data.

In detail:

You have the right at any time to receive confirmation from us as to whether or not you are processing personal data relating to them. If this is the case, you have the right to ask us for free information about the personal data stored with you, together with a copy of this data. There is also the right to the following information:

1. processing purposes;
2. The categories of personal data that are processed;
3. The recipients or categories of recipients to whom the personal data has been disclosed or is still disclosed, in particular to recipients in third countries or to international organisations;
4. If possible, the planned duration for which the personal data is stored, or, if this is not possible, the criteria for determining that duration;
5. The existence of a right to rectify or delete the personal data relating to it or to restrict the processing by the person responsible or a right of objection against such processing;
6. The existence of a right of appeal by a supervisory authority;
7. If the personal data are not collected from you, all available information about the origin of the data;
8. The existence of automated decision-making, including Profiling Under Article 22 (1) and (4) DSGVO and, at least in these cases, meaningful information about the logic involved, the scope and the intended effects of such processing for you.

Where personal data are transmitted to a third country or to an international organisation, you have the right to be informed of the appropriate guarantees in accordance with article 46 DSGVO in connection with the transmission.

5.2 Right to Rectification

You have the right to require us to rectify and, if necessary, to complete any personal data relating to you.

In detail:

You have the right to demand from us without delay the rectification of any incorrect personal data relating to you. Considering the purposes of processing, you have the right to request the completion of incomplete personal data, including by means of a supplementary declaration.

5.3 Right to delete ("right to be forgotten")

In a number of cases, we are obligated to delete personal data relating to you.

In detail:

In accordance with article 17 (1) DSGVO, you have the right to require us to delete any personal data relating to you immediately, and we are obligated to remove any personal data immediately, provided that one of the following reasons applies:

1. The personal data are no longer necessary for the purposes for which they were collected or processed in any other way.
2. You revoke your consent to which the processing referred to in Article 6 Para 1 P. 1 a) DSGVO or Article 9 Paragraph 2 a) DSGVO, and there is no other legal basis for processing.
3. You file an opposition to processing, according to Article 21 Paragraph 1 DSGVO, and there are no overriding reasons for the processing. Or you file an opposition to processing in accordance with Article 21 Paragraph 2 DSGVO.
4. The personal data has been processed in an unlawful form.
5. The deletion of personal data is necessary for the fulfilment of a legal obligation under union law or the law of the Member States to which we are subject.
6. The personal data have been collected in relation to the information society services offered in accordance with Article 8 Paragraph 1 DSGVO.

If we have made the personal data public and we are obliged to delete it according to article 17 para 1 DSGVO, we shall take appropriate measures, including technical means, taking into account the available technology and the implementation costs, in order to inform the responsible person, who process the personal data, that you have requested the deletion of all links to this personal data or of copies or replicas of these personal data.

5.4 Right to restrict processing

In a number of cases, you are entitled to require us to restrict the processing of your personal data.

In detail:

You have the right to require us to restrict the processing if one of the following conditions is met:

1. The accuracy of the personal data will be disputed by you for a period of time which allows us to verify the accuracy of the personal data,
2. The processing is unlawful, and you have rejected the deletion of the personal data and have instead demanded the restriction of the use of personal data;
3. We no longer need the personal data for the purposes of processing, but you need the data for the assertion, exercise or defence of legal claims, or
4. You have objected to the processing in accordance with Article 21 Paragraph 1 DSGVO, for as long as it is not yet determined whether the legitimate reasons of our organisation outweigh those of your own.

5.5 Right to Data transferability

You have the right to receive, transmit, or transmit from us the personal data in a machine-readable format.

In detail:

You have the right to receive the personal data that you have provided to us in a structured, common and machine-readable format, and you have the right to send this data to another person responsible without hindrance by us, provided that

1. The processing on a consent according to Article 6 Para 1 P. 1 a) DSGVO or Article 9 para. 2 a) DSGVO or on a contract in accordance with Article 6 Para 1 P. 1 b) DSGVO is based and
2. Processing is done using automated procedures.

When exercising your right to transfer data in accordance with paragraph 1, you have the right to obtain that the personal data are transmitted directly by us to another person responsible, as far as this is technically feasible.

5.6 Right to Object

You have the right to object to the lawful processing of your personal data by us if this is based on your particular situation and does not outweigh our interests in processing.

In detail:

You have the right at any time, for reasons arising from your particular situation, to object to the processing of personal data relating to you which in Article 6 (1) (e) or (f) DSGVO is made to appeal; This shall also apply to the from this Article allowed Profiling. We do not process the personal data any more, unless we can prove compelling reasons for the processing that outweigh your interests, rights and freedoms, or the processing is for the assertion, exercise or defence of legal claims.

If personal data are processed by us in order to operate direct advertising, you have the right at any time to object to the processing of personal data relating to you for the purpose of such advertising; This also applies to the Profiling, as far as it is related to such direct advertising.

You have the right, for reasons arising out of your particular situation, against the processing of any personal data relating to you, for scientific or historical research purposes or for statistical purposes in accordance with Article 89 Paragraph 1 DSGVO is made to appeal, unless the processing is necessary to fulfil a task in the public interest.

5.7 Automated decisions including Profiling

You have the right not to rely solely on automated processing, including Profiling – To be subjected to a decision which has a legal effect on you or which in a similar manner significantly impairs you.

An automated decision-making based on personal data collected does not take place.

5.8 Right to revoke a data protection consent

You have the right to revoke your consent to the processing of personal data at any time.

5.9 Right to appeal to a supervisory authority

You have the right to appeal to a supervisory authority, in particular in the Member State of your place of residence, your workplace or the place where the alleged infringement is concerned, if you consider that the processing of the personal data is unlawful.

6 Security

We are committed to the security of your data within the limits of the applicable data protection laws and technical possibilities.

We point out that data transmission on the Internet (e.g. when communicating via e-mail) can have security vulnerabilities. It is not possible to completely protect the data from access by third parties.

In order to secure your data, we maintain technical and organisational security measures according to article 32 DSGVO, which we constantly adapt to the state of the art.

We also do not guarantee that our offer is available at certain times; Faults, interruptions or failures cannot be excluded. The servers we use are regularly backed up carefully.

7 Passing on of data to third parties, no transfer of data to non-EU-countries

In principle we use your personal data only within our organisation.

If and to the extent that we turn on third parties in the context of the fulfilment of contracts (e.g. logistics service providers), The personal data transmitted is to the extent to which the transmission is necessary for the corresponding performance.

There is no data transferred to places or persons outside the EU and is not planned.
